## TSO and its contribution

On Kindercampus Zuidas we opted for the 'five-matched-days' model: 5 days with the same start and end time. At lunchtime there is a break for the children and the teachers. However, it is not a continuous grid (continurooster). In that case there will be no pause for teachers, they accompany the pupils during lunch.

At the Kindercampus lunch time break has been arranged in a different way. The lunch break for the pupils is 45 minutes. The first 15 minutes of this pause (TSO, Tussen Schoolse Opvang) is provided by the teacher. The other 30 minutes the children spent time with the educational assistants only. After the break these assistants are extra in the classroom for one hour two days a week (school contributes for these extra hours). In this way we can achieve extra care so the teachers have more time for educational matters.

The educational assistants are also involved in after-school care (NSO). So, the children are always familiar with people who are involved in guidance.

Parents that want their children to lunch at school pay € 1.60 for each time. The amount for TSO is checked by the MR (the formal Parents Council) of Kindercampus Zuidas.

The amount for contribution is calculated as follows:

The school year consists of 12 weeks of holidays (6 weeks during the summer, 2 weeks Christmas, 2 May- weeks, 1 week spring and 1 week autumn). Remain 40 weeks. We count at school with 38 weeks of teaching. However, there are certainly 10 extra days off. So, on average, the children go to school for 36 weeks.  $36 \times 5$  (days per week) = 180 days.  $180 \times € 1.60 = € 288$  per year.

The contribution for the TSO can be paid by parents when the children start using it. The start date is the first school day. All parents receive an itemized bill. You can pay the amount at once or in installments.

If you don't want to make use of the TSO, you can pick up your child(ren) at 11.45am to have lunch at home. At 12:30am school starts again.
